Our current seven-day infection rate stands at 429.7 cases per 100,000 which is higher than the England average of 322.2 cases per 100,000. Although the number of infections has increased in County Durham, as mentioned last week this has been expected as students return to schools and colleges. We continue to ask that people take up the offer of the vaccine and remain to be cautious when out and about, applying control measures such as Hands, Face, Space, Fresh Air. This week, the Prime Minister shared the Covid Winter Plan which aims to sustain the progress made and prepare the country for future challenges, while ensuring the National Health Service (NHS) does not come under unsustainable pressure.

To support businesses through the autumn and winter period, the Government will continue to provide up-to-date Working Safely guidance on how employers can reduce the risks in their workplace. In addition, the Government will support improved ventilation in key settings.
